- **Governing Board Members' Update**

EFCTS Board members were provided with information on many of the building trade programs including an update about a company in Bremen, Ohio purchased by Worthington Industries in need of 70 welders.

Delaware Area Career Center

Mr. Bischoff reported that the DACC board met last evening. The Treasurer provided Board members with a cost per student analysis comparing this year's costs with last year's. The ODE State Report card was also reviewed with Board members.

Metropolitan Educational Council

Dr. Goodney reported on the September 10, 2014 Board meeting to approve several purchasing contracts and updated Board members on the growth MEC is experiencing on the purchasing side of the organization. The ITC side continues to grow net entities primarily with Charter Schools.

Board members were updated on a meeting held yesterday that included population growth projections in the region and House Bill 5 to reform municipal income tax in Ohio that will have an impact on school districts.

Dr. Goodney distributed the latest Legislative Update prepared by the Ohio Educational Service Center Association that provides information on the legislative issues of interest to Ohio's Educational Service Centers.
